


# SEVEN DUNKS IN A MUDDY PUDDLE

## The Captain and the Captive

2 Kings 5:1-6;

Please open your Bibles and read along with me:



2 Kings 5:1-6 "Now Naaman, captain of the host of the king of Syria, was a great man with his master, and honorable, because by him Jehovah had given victory unto Syria: he was also a mighty man of valor, but he was a leper. 2 And the Syrians had gone out in bands, and had brought away captive out of the land of Israel a little maiden; and she waited on

Naaman's wife. 3 And she said unto her mistress, Would that my lord were with the prophet that is in Samaria! then would he recover him of his leprosy. 4 And one went in, and told his lord, saying, Thus and thus said the maiden that is of the land of Israel. 5 And the king of Syria said, Go now, and I will send a letter unto the king of Israel. And he departed,

and took with him ten talents of silver, and six thousand pieces of gold, and ten changes of raiment. 6 And he brought the letter to the king of Israel, saying, And now when this letter is come unto thee, behold, I have sent Naaman my servant to thee, that thou mayest recover him of his leprosy."

ten talents of silver @ 75lbs each = \$20,000.00

six thousand pieces of gold @ 11 grams each = \$2,866,000.00

ten changes of raiment = ????????

#### Introduction:

The healing of Naaman, the Leper is not just a story of the healing of a man from one of the most dreaded diseases of ancient times, but it is a story of salvation, one which illustrates the spiritual salvation man finds only in Jesus Christ and how men come to find that salvation in Christ.

In Naaman's healing there are a variety of people who play different parts; some good and vital to the salvation and healing of Naaman and others not so good.

All illustrate the various good and evil persuasions of people that either aid or hinder bringing men to Christ.

### Realize also that Naaman lived 894 years before Christ. I. Naaman -

#### 1. "Now Naaman, captain of the host of the king of Syria, was a great man with his master, and honorable, because by him Jehovah had given victory unto Syria: he was also a mighty man of valor, but he was a leper."

A. Captain (The commanding general of Benhadad's army;)

B. Great man with his master — held in favor and esteem:

C. Honorable - greatly respected by all ranks and degrees among the people:

- D. Because by him the LORD had given deliverance unto Syria:
- E. He was also a mighty man in valor a very courageous valiant man:
- F. But, He was a leper was stricken with the leprosy, which had deformed and disgraced his person, and weakened his strength, and dispirited him; all his grandeur and honor could not protect him from this loathsome disease.

A leper saw portions of their bodies become numb, muscles atrophy (waste away), tendons contract making the hands like claws, and then the ulceration of the fingers and toes and hands and feet resulting in their loss bit by bit until the whole hand or foot was gone.

We must not miss the picture God wants us to see from this emphasis in Scripture.

Sin is like this.

Because of man's separation from God, because of his spiritually dead condition and the hardness of his heart, he becomes insensitive, callused, restless and never satisfied. He often does not experience severe pain from his sin, only insensitivity, restless misery, and futility, ever seeking some means of fulfillment running from one thing to another.

# II. A Nameless Maid-

Verses 2 "And the Syrians had gone out in bands, and had brought away captive out of the land of Israel a little maiden; and she waited on Naaman's wife. 3 And she said unto her mistress, Would that my lord were with the prophet that is in Samaria! then would he recover him of his leprosy. 4 And one went in, and told his lord, saying, Thus and thus said the maiden that is of the land of Israel."

A. Captive - kidnapped from her home in Israel; this girl was an unwilling missionary, taken captive from Israel and now in Syria.

Yet God allowed the tragedy of her captivity to accomplish a greater good.

The young girl illustrates the mysterious ways God works.

She was probably raised in a godly home, yet taken from her family at a young age.

It was an irreplaceable loss for her parents, and one they no doubt grieved over every day.

Yet, she was greatly used in a simple way.

B. Servant - to Naaman's wife; Honorable in her service - she did not whine or complain about her LOT.

C. Noble character - She saw the need of those about her; If only my master were with the prophet who is in Samaria!

This young girl was an outstanding example of a faithful witness in her current circumstance.

She cared enough to speak up, and she had faith enough to believe that Elisha would heal him of his leprosy.


D. Brave in her demeanor – She told of the healing prophet of the true God.

"And see the benefits of a religious education!

Had not this little maid been brought up in the knowledge of the true God, she had not been the instrument of so great a salvation." (Clarke)

### **E.** Selfless in her prayer –

"...Would God my lord were with the prophet that is in Samaria! for he would recover him of his leprosy."



# III. King Benhadad -

5-6 – "And the king of Syria said, Go now, and I will send a letter unto the king of Israel. And he departed, and took with him ten talents of silver, and six thousand pieces of gold, and ten changes of raiment. 6 And he brought the letter to the king of Israel, saying, And now when this letter is come unto thee, behold, I

have sent Naaman my servant to thee, that thou mayest recover him of his leprosy."

A. I have sent Naaman my servant to you, that you may heal him of his leprosy:

B. And took with him ten talents of silver Estimates say that Naaman took more than \$3 million dollars with him to Israel.

All this together shows how desperate Naaman's condition was, and how badly the King of Syria wanted to help him.

# IV. King Jehoram - (son of Ahab, brother of the late Ahaziah) apparently unaware of the prophet Elisha.

Verse 7 "And it came to pass, when the king of Israel had read the letter, that he rent his clothes, and said, Am I God, to kill and to make alive, that this man doth send unto me to recover a man of his leprosy? but

consider, I pray you, and see how he seeketh a quarrel against me."

When the king of Israel (Jehoram) read the letter, he was understandably upset.

First, it was obviously out of his power to heal Naaman's leprosy.

Second, he had no relationship with the prophet of the God who *did* have the power to heal.

He thought the king of Syria sought a quarrel.

It is very interesting that a little maid living in the outer territories of Israel is aware of the prophet of God and the King is not or chooses not to be! Sounds like politics today.

The politicians are unaware or are not concerned with the desires of their constituents.

Also the king of Syria assumed that the king of Israel was on a much better relationship with Elisha than he really was.

It is easy for others to assume that we have a better relationship with God than we really do.

## V. Elisha, God's Spokesman -

Verses 8-12 "And it was so, when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had rent his clothes, that he sent to the king, saying, Wherefore hast thou rent thy

clothes? let him come now to me, and he shall know that there is a prophet in Israel. 9 So Naaman came with his horses and with his chariots, and stood at the door of the house of Elisha. 10 And Elisha sent a messenger unto him, saying, Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and thy flesh shall come again to thee, and thou shalt be clean.

11. But Naaman was wroth, and went away, and said, Behold, I thought, He will surely come out to me, and stand, and call on the name of Jehovah his God, and wave his hand over the place, and recover the leper. 12 Are not Abanah and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? may I not wash in them, and be clean? So he turned and went away in a rage."

#### A. Elisha sent a messenger to him:

Naaman took the trouble to come to the home of Elisha, but Elisha refused to give him a personal audience.

He simply sent a messenger.

This was humbling to Naaman, who was accustomed to being honored.

- He sent a messenger because Naaman had over-estimated his own importance.
- "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored to you, and you shall be clean:"

These were simple, uncomplicated instructions.

Yet as Naaman's reaction demonstrates, these were humbling instructions.

C. "He will surely come out to me and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, and wave his hand over the place, and heal the leprosy:"

Naaman had it all figured out; In his great need, he anticipated a way God would work, and he was offended when God didn't work the way he expected.

D. "He turned and went away in a range:"

Because his expectation of how God should work was crushed, Naaman wanted nothing to do with Elisha.

If the answer was in washing in a river, Naaman knew there were better rivers in his own land.

#### VI. A Nameless Servant -

Verse 13 "And his servants came near, and spake unto him, and said, My father, if the prophet had bid thee do some great thing, wouldest thou not have done it? How much rather then, when he saith to thee, Wash, and be clean?"

A. His servants came near and spoke to him:


Thank God for faithful subordinates who will speak to their superiors and any one else in their time of need.

Naaman was obviously angry, yet they were bold enough to give him the good advice he needed to hear. B. If the prophet had told you to do something great, would you not have done it?

The servants of Naaman used a brilliantly logical approach.

If Elisha had asked Naaman to sacrifice 100 or 1,000 animals to the God of Israel, Naaman would have done it immediately.

Yet because his request was easy to do and humbling, Naaman first refused.



## VII. Naaman's Healing -

Verse 14 "Then went he down, and dipped himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God; and his flesh came again like unto the flesh of a little child, and he was clean."

A. According to the saying of the man of God:

Naaman did exactly what Elisha told him to do.

Therefore we can say that each dunk in the Jordan was a step of faith, trusting in the word of God through His prophet.

1. Wiseman, on the ancient Hebrew word translated dipped: "Naaman 'plunged' in the River Jordan.

This signified total obedience to the divine word."

2. Spurgeon saw Naaman attacked by two enemies:

**Proud Self**, who internally demanded that Elisha come out and see him,

and *Evil Questioning*, who questioned why he should wash in the Jordan when he had better rivers back in his homeland.

## Naaman overcame these two enemies and did what God told him to do.



B. And his flesh was restored like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean:

Naaman's response of faith was generously rewarded.

God answered his faith with total, miraculous healing.

1. "The simple method of this miracle, performed without the prophet there, did give God the credit.

It was obvious that the healing came from Yahweh rather than from the sort of magical incantation that Naaman had anticipated." (Dilday)



# VIII. Naaman STANDS before the Prophet of GOD -

Verse 15-16 "And he returned to the man of God, he and all his company, and came, and stood before him; and he said, Behold now, I know that there is no God in all the earth, but in Israel: now therefore, I pray thee, take a present of thy servant. 16 But he said, As Jehovah liveth, before

whom I stand, I will receive none. And he urged him to take it; but he refused."

# A. And he returned to the man of God:



This was a fine display of gratitude.

Naaman was like the one leper out of the ten Jesus healed who came back to thank Jesus (Luke 17:12-19).

1. Before, Naaman expected the prophet to come to him.

Now he returned to the man of God and stood before him.

B. "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel:"

It wasn't just the healing that persuaded Naaman of this.

It was the healing connected with the word of the prophet.

Together, this was convincing evidence to Naaman that the God Elisha represented was the true God in all the earth.

C. Please take a gift from your servant:

We can say that Naaman only meant well by this gesture.

He felt it was appropriate to support the ministry of this man of God whom the LORD had used so greatly to bring healing.

However, Elisha steadfastly insisted that he would receive nothing from Naaman.

### Conclusion:

Lessons to Be Learned

### 1. From the Nameless Maid -

Philippians 4:10 "I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me. You were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity. 11 Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content.

12 I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. 13 I can do all things through him who strengthens me."

#### 2. From Naaman –

Proverbs 14:12 "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death."

Proverbs 16:25 "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death."

### 3. From the Nameless Servant -

James 5:20 "Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins."

### 4. From God-

Luke 4:27 "And many lepers were in Israel in the time of Eliseus the prophet; and none of them was cleansed, saving Naaman the Syrian."

God sovereignly worked to bring about the (Cleansing, SALVATION of Naaman).
