Genesis 2:10-24

Two Gardens

We should not overlook the obvious contrast between the situation and conduct of Adam in this garden and the situation and conduct of the second Adam, Jesus Christ, in the Garden of Gethsemane before his arrest and crucifixion.

Discuss the contrast the good of the Garden of Eden that Adam and Eve had with the evil that lay before Christ as He came to the Garden of Gethsemane. (Gen. 1:26-30; Mt. 26:39; Mk. 14:36; Lk. 22:42)

The second contrast between Adam and Eve's conduct in Eden and Christ's conduct in Gethsemane is that our first parents spent their time talking to Satan while Jesus spent his time talking with God. What does this mean for our lives in Christ? (Jn. 18:2; Lk. 22:40

The third point of contrast between Adam and Eve, and the Lord, Jesus Christ is that they fell into sin and He conquered sin. Adam and Eve listened to Satan and fell. Jesus wrestled with His human nature in prayer in the Garden and prevailed sinning not. Discuss these differences.

In verses 14 to 24 God creates Eve for Adam. Discuss the process and what this means relationships between men and women and husbands and wives.
