

1. *"When you are praying, do not use meaningless repetition as the Gentiles do, for they suppose that they will be HEARD for their many words. So do not be like them; for your Father knows what you need BEFORE you ask Him."* (Matthew 6:7-8)

2. Prayer is truly SOUL food for a believer.

3. We end prayer with "Amen." The Hebrew word "Amen" means "so be it" or "let it be TRUE".

4. God's thoughts are NOT our thoughts nor are His ways our ways.

5. Jesus' prayer in John 17 has been called the "High Priestly Prayer." Jesus intercedes for believers as our High Priest before the THRONE of the Father.

6. Jesus was "lifting up His eyes to heaven" as a symbolic act. One looks SKYWARD while praying to show that one is giving full attention to God.

7. God's glory defines His attributes. JESUS then, by His life and ministry, exhibits God's glory.

8. 1 Kings records the history of the transition of the monarchy from King David to his son, Solomon. Here we see God's glory as CLOUD and light.

9. "Shekinah Glory" is a transliteration of a Hebrew word meaning "the one who DWELLS".
