1. A dream which troubled him and made him afraid - Daniel 4:4-5;

2. His dissatisfaction with the wise men of Babylon - Daniel 4:6-7;

3. The dream is told to Daniel - Daniel 4:8-18

C. DANIEL'S INTERPRETATION and Counsel - Daniel 4:19-27;

D. THE DREAM'S FULFILLMENT - Daniel 4:28-33;

1. And the end of the time, understanding returned to the king - Daniel 4:34-35;

2. Nebuchadnezzar restored - Daniel 4:36-37;

E. THE MAIN POINT OF THE DREAM AND ITS FULFILLMENT...

- 1. Stated several times in this chapter
 - a. In the dream itself Daniel 4:17;
 - b. By Daniel, in providing the interpretation Daniel 4:25-26;
 - c. As spoken from Heaven when the dream came to pass Daniel 4:32
 - d. By Nebuchadnezzar when he returned to his senses Daniel 4:34-35
- 2. To learn that "The Most High Rules In the Kingdom of Men"
 - a. Which Daniel acknowledged from Nebuchadnezzar's first dream Daniel 2:20-21;
 - b. And now does the king, from his second dream!

II. CHRIST NOW REIGNS IN THE KINGDOM OF MEN...

A. As foretold by the prophets -

1. In **Psalms 2:1-12; the Scripture speaks of rejection, coronation, rule and the** importance of kings and judges serving the Lord - **Psalms 2:10-12** -- **Acts 4:23-28** confirms that this passage refers to Jesus!

2. In Psalms 110, which tells of a) <u>The rule of Christ in the midst of His enemies</u> - Psalms 110:1-2;
b) <u>The voluntary service of His people (the church)</u>, and the priestly service of their King - Psalms 110:3-4; and c) <u>The exercise of judgment among the nations</u> - Psalms 110:5-7; Acts 2:32-36 confirms that this passage refers to Jesus!

B. As taught by the apostles -

1. Governing authorities exist as appointed by God, to serve as ministers of God - Romans 13:1-4;

2. Why pray for those in authority, unless God through Christ can do something about it? - 1 Timothy 2:1-2;
