## **Lesson Twelve HO**

**Review:** The Passover – Leviticus 23:5 "In the fourteenth day of the first month at even is the Lord's passover."

**The Feast of Unleavened Bread** – Leviticus 23:6-8; In the Bible LEAVEN symbolizes sin: <u>Matthew 16:6</u> "Then Jesus said unto them, Take heed and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and of the Sadducees."

Matthew 16:11-12; Mark 8:15; Luke 12:1; 1 Corinthians 5:6-8; Galatians 5:9;

<u>Passover</u> is a picture of Christ death on the cross, a one-time act. <u>Unleavened bread</u> represents a holy life, which should be the characteristic of the believer after he or she has received Christ.

Whatever they may have thought previously of the rustic teacher from Galilee, they certainly had to admit that it seemed more than coincidental that:

He was crucified on Passover;

He was buried on Unleavened Bread;

He rose on First Fruits, and

He sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.
