John 18:12-14, 19-24

1. Annas had reason to dislike Jesus greatly as Jesus had, at least twice, disrupted his cash flow by cleansing the **__TEMPLE__** as recorded in John 2 and Matthew 21.
2. The question is, "Do you trust God? Do you have faith in God? Will you stand firm or **__DENY__** Him during times of trouble as Peter did?"

4. God created Israel to be His chosen nation. He gave them His revealed word, the Scriptures, to guide their lives and laws to live by. These laws were **__DIFFERENT__** from all other nations.
