1. The Apostle John was the son of Zebedee and the younger brother of \_\_\_\_\_JAMES\_\_\_\_\_.

2. From John's Gospel, Epistles and Revelation, we know that he was a personal eyewitness of the life and work of \_JES;US\_\_, lived in the region known today as \_TURKEY\_\_ and had a position of authority as a leader of the church.

3. <u>POLYCARP</u>, who identified himself as a disciple of John the Apostle, was burned at the stake in 156 AD.

5. The First Epistle of John combatted a <u>HERESY</u> called Gnosticism, which taught that salvation was found through a higher, spiritual knowledge that ordinary people, including <u>CHRISTIANS</u>, did not have.

6. As an old man, John, a teacher, preacher, pastor and shepherd was exiled on the island of Patmos where he received the vision he recorded in <u>\_\_\_\_\_REVELATION\_\_\_\_</u>, a source of great encouragement to him.

7. The Apostles Paul, Peter and John taught that <u>truth</u> must be proclaimed in <u>LOVE</u>. Christ was the perfect image of these two in balance.

8. To the end of his life, John never tolerated deception, lies and sin and was always committed to the truth. He loved Christ and those Christ \_\_\_\_ENTRUSTED\_\_\_\_\_ to his care with a deep love.

9. John was the most clear-cut, authoritative and absolute writer of the New Testament who was also known in history as the Apostle of \_\_\_\_LOVE\_\_\_.

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4. The Apostle John does not identify himself by name in his writings, but as "the Apostle whom Jesus <u>LOVED</u>..."

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
